Practical Information:

Location

The Annual Meeting will take place at the University of Milan, Palazzo Greppi, via Sant'Antonio, 12 in Milan.

Transport

Arriving from *LINATE* airport:

- by taxi: the taxi fare to the city centre is around 20 to 25 € (about 15 min).
- by bus: the shuttle bus leaves every 30 min. to the Central Station. The trip takes about 25 min. Tickets cost (5 €). City bus No 73 goes to the San Babila metro Station (near Duomo) every 7-8 minutes, tickets cost 1.50 €

Arriving from *MALPENSA* airport:

- by train: Malpensa Express www.malpensaexpress.it to Cadorna, Garibaldi and Milan Central Stations. Trains depart from Malpensa Airport Terminal 1 and 2. The journey takes around 45 min. with trains leaving every 30 min. Tickets cost 13 € and are also purchasable online (20 € for a return ticket).
- by bus: Malpensa Shuttle www.malpensashuttle.it to Central Station. Coaches depart every 20 min from Terminal 1 and 2 and the trip takes about 50 min. The ticket costs 10 € (one way, 16 € return ticket) and can be purchased directly on the bus or online. Coaches have large baggage-holds.

Arriving from *ORIO AL SERIO* Airport:

- by bus: shuttle bus (about 50 min.) to Milano Centrale Railway station: www.orioshuttle.com. Tickets (7€) can be purchased directly on the bus or online. Coaches have large baggage-holds.
